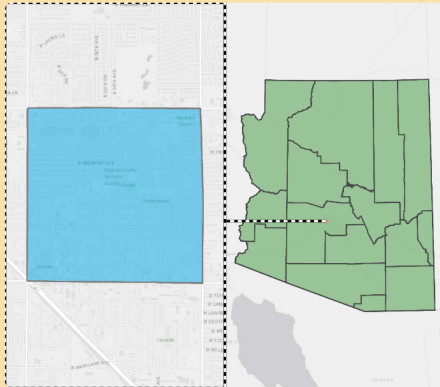


# Glendale Central, Maricopa County Childhood Lead Poisoning<sup>†</sup>



Census Tract 925

Maricopa

Lead is a metal found naturally in the environment and has been used in many products, including paint and gasoline. While there are some beneficial uses, it can also be toxic to humans and cause adverse **health effects**. People can become exposed to lead by swallowing or breathing in lead dust which causes lead poisoning.

In 2016, there were

- 34,661 children were tested for lead poisoning in Maricopa County.
- 146 children tested had confirmed blood lead levels of 10 µg/dL or greater in Maricopa County.



Location Selected: Census Tract 925

Risk Level: High-Risk

Description: One or more children have been identified with elevated blood lead levels in this census tract in the past 5 years.

Recommendation: A blood test is recommended at 12 & 24 months of age or by 6 years of age if not previously tested. Schedule an appointment for a blood test with your child's doctor.
